I love to teach the Enneagram because it reminds us that, first and foremost, our true nature is the psyche (soul), not the persona (ego). Similarly, A Course in Miracles teaches us that we are not our body: “I am not a body, I am free. For I am still as God created me.” The soul is made of love; and our bodies are made of stardust. The purpose of Easter is to remember that we are not a body who has a soul; we are a soul that has a body. On Easter Saturday, I gave my Enneagram class this inquiry: “Tell me how you experience my soul.” Please try it! Ground yourself again in soul awareness.

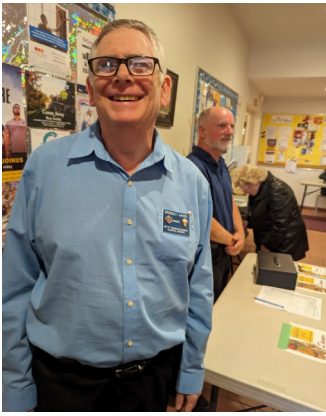
God is not found in the soul by adding anything, but by a process of subtraction,” wrote Meister Eckhart, the German philosopher and mystic. Modern spirituality often emphasizes manifesting, attracting and adding things to your life. Yet, in letting go we often experience our greatest joy. What could you be letting go of this Easter? For example, an old role you play in relationships, (e.g. the martyr, the people-pleaser, the giver)? An old grievance, perhaps? A Course in Miracles reminds us, “Each day, each hour and minute, even each second, you are deciding between the crucifixion and the resurrection.” And that, “each decision that you make is one between a grievance and a miracle.”

Finding Jesus in dirty feet

Why did Jesus wash the feet of his disciples? Not because they were too lazy to handle their own hygiene and as their servant he wanted to make life easy for them! Rather, he gave them (and us) a model to imitate.

Naturally, we want Jesus to make our lives easier. Isn't that the purpose behind many of our prayers? Well, surprise! We do get what we ask for, but not the way we had imagined. When we imitate Jesus, it's the way we cope with the difficulties of life that becomes easier.

Have you washed anyone's feet lately? Maybe you haven't literally soaped up a friend's smelly feet as a sign of your unconditional love, but I'm sure you have given of yourself in a foot-washing way.

To wash the feet of others is to love them even when they don't deserve your love.

To wash the feet of others is to do good to them even if they don't return the favor.

To wash the feet of others is to consider their needs as important as your own.

To wash the feet of others is to forgive them even if they don't say, "I'm sorry."

To wash the feet of others is to serve them even when the task is unpleasant.

To wash the feet of others is to let them know you care when they feel downtrodden or burdened.

To wash the feet of others is to be generous with what you have.

To wash the feet of others is to turn the cheek instead of retaliating when you're treated unfairly.

To wash the feet of others is to make adjustments in your plans so you can serve their needs.

To wash the feet of others is to serve them with humility and not with any hope of reward.

Notice the posture of Jesus. He knelt. Imagine Jesus kneeling in front of you now, lowering himself to the level of your feet and tenderly ministering to your needs. He is in fact doing this, right now, today. And he will do it again and again, as often as you need him to care about you!

He is asking you to go and do likewise: Be the hands of Jesus that wash the feet of the people around you. You are the answer to their prayers!

By serving others, we gain understanding of what Jesus did for us 2000 years ago — and we become more observant of how he's ministering to us. We meet Jesus in the dirty feet that we lower ourselves to clean.

Popes

Pope Pelagius 1 the 60th Pope

April 16, 556 - March 3, 561 A.D.

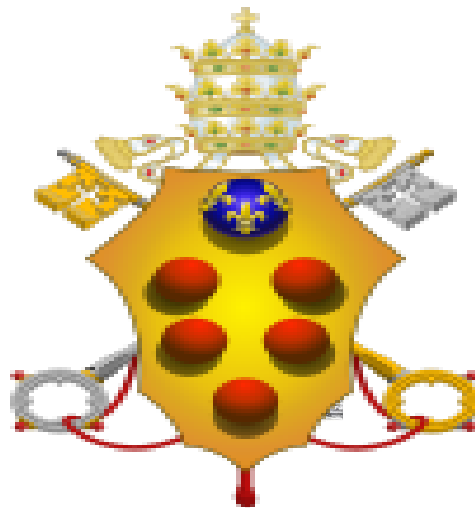
Pelagius I was born in Rome to a noble family, where his dad, John, served as grand poobah of one of the city's two civil districts. Pelagius first comes on the scene in his journey to Constantinople with Pope Agapetus I (three popes ago), where he was eventually named *nuncio*, or *papal representative, for the Roman Church. During Vigilius' papacy, Pelagius served in the same role, but instead was placed in Rome while the pope was being detained in the East.*

He did much to restore church buildings and infrastructure in Rome after it had been under siege in wartime. Pelagius was elected on April 16, 556, nearly a year after Vigilius' death, and reigned for just under five years. He died on March 3, 561, and was buried the next day in front of the sacristy in St. Peter's Basilica.

He seemed to have been a real stand-up guy. Called the "Father of the poor and of his country," Pelagius poured out his own fortune to care for the afflicted in the city while it was under siege by the Goths, then did so again after the war had ended, establishing a treasury of money and clothes to give solely to the poor.
