By-laws for Assembly 3477, 4th Degree

By-Laws Online

An application called By-Laws Online is available on the Knights of Columbus website that allows Councils and Assemblies to establish by-laws electronically, receive automatic approval, submit a request for printing (if the Council/Assembly wishes to have the by-laws printed by the Supreme Council) and maintain a historical file of by-laws that had been previously been submitted and approved. The program is available to Grand Knights and Advocates of councils and Faithful Navigators, Admirals, and Pilots of Assemblies. The Supreme Council established the By-Laws Online Program to ensure that all councils and assemblies are using a uniform set of procedures.

Since it established the By-Laws Online Program, the Supreme Council is no longer accepting or reviewing council or assembly by-laws that have not been prepared using the online template. If a council or assembly wishes to amend its existing by-laws, it must use the online template to do so.

++In order to access By-Laws Online, you will need a registered account on Officers Online, which is an online resource that offers a menu of helpful applications. Go to www.kofc.org, click on "Officers" on the right side of the home page, and follow the instructions on the site. If you do not have a registered account with Officers Online, or if you need assistance obtaining a user name or password, please contact Supreme Council Customer Service Department at 1-800-380-9995. Once you have obtained access to Officers Online, click on the by-laws online tab.

The Customer Service Department is available Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00am and 7:30pm EST. You may also reach them via e-mail at info@kofc.org.

Farewell to the Circle

A Tribute to the Columbian Squires
From Montreal to the World — A Century of Brotherhood

There is a particular quiet that falls when a brotherhood ends — not the silence of failure, but the bitter-sweet hush of a chapter closing after a century of prayer, handshakes, retreats, service projects, and the steady shaping of boys into men of faith and character.

For communities around the world, that quiet is now settling over the Columbian Squires.

The Spark. The Columbian Squires were officially launched on August 4, 1925, by Brother Barnabas McDonald and Supreme Director Daniel A. Tobin. Built on the image of a medieval squire training under a knight, the program called Catholic boys to grow in moral courage, leadership, service, and civic responsibility. Its purpose was simple and noble: to help young men become the kind of Christian citizens the world so urgently needs.

Taking Root. The movement reached Canadian soil on February 2, 1930, when Dean Laurendeau Circle #57 was instituted in Windsor, Ontario — the first Canadian Circle. At its height, the Squires united thousands of young Catholic leaders across more than 1,500 circles worldwide. Their motto, inscribed beside the physical, intellectual, spiritual, and civic pillars, was clear: *Esto Dignus — Be Worthy.*

The End Arrives. The decline began quietly in 2016, when new circles were no longer being chartered. The final chapter came in March 2026, when the remaining Squire circles were directed to close by June 30, 2026. One hundred and one years after Brother Barnabas helped light the flame, the program that formed generations of young Catholic men was brought to an end.

A Legacy That Cannot Close. A Circle can be shut down. A charter can be revoked. A name can fade from the roster. But the men shaped inside those meetings — the boy who learned to draft and manage a budget at thirteen, the one who organized his first service project at twelve, or the one who stood before his peers at fifteen with knees shaking and spoke anyway — that formation does not dissolve with an executive order.

It lives on in the young men who were mentored, challenged, trusted, and formed to lead.

Now what? A quiet rumble is being heard from the Ontario Squires State Board and from across the Order. More will be shared in the coming weeks. Please keep us in your prayers this month as we struggle with that simple question:

Will we experience a long-term disability? And, as much as we don’t like to think about it, will the Lord call us home at a time we don’t expect?

There are many unknowns, but there are things you can do to protect your family and build security. For example, you can guard your loved ones through life insurance, long-term care insurance and disability income insurance.

Before I close, I’d like to share a story about our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. When he was 20 years old and in seminary, his father, Patrick, passed away. This left young Michael uncertain whether he would need to leave seminary and work in a factory to support his siblings and widowed mother. Thankfully, his bishop intervened and provided financial support to allow him to continue his studies for the priesthood.

As a result of this experience, Father McGivney knew firsthand how the death of a loved one could bring about uncertainty for the family.

In founding the Knights of Columbus, he started an Order that allows Catholic men like you to be the protectors their families need — even during life's hardest moments.

First Step Literacy is a not-for profit local organization that offers free tutoring in reading, writing, math and computer skills to adults +18 years old who are not currently in school. First Step also offers

English as a Second Language courses. One of its primary fundraising activities is the "Grate Groan Spelling Bee" in which teams of adults compete in a spelling competition. It is a fun event which is enhanced by the creative themed costumes worn by the competitive teams. Most importantly, this event raises funds to support a much-needed service in our local community. Polish up your spelling skills because CWL is planning to register a team from St. Paul's Parish for next year's competition!

The Annual CWL Garage Sale, held the last weekend of May, was a repeat success! This achievement is a combination of the generosity of our parishioners who dropped off vast varieties of items; our CWL members who worked tirelessly for six days preparing and selling items; and our generous purchasers who readily dug into their pockets to contribute to our fundraising efforts. Items that were not sold were packed and donated to The Attic. CWL members will, in due course, determine which charities will receive donations from our Garage Sale proceeds.

The CWL Northern Retreat took place on Saturday, June 6th at Martyrs' Shrine. Four of our CWL members participated with approximately 50 other women representing various councils from Northern Region and Toronto's Executive Council. Attendees spent a day in prayer, reflection and in celebration of the Shrine's 100th anniversary. Fr. Matthew, the keynote speaker, is a Jesuit priest who has just finished his studies in Ottawa in ancient languages. His address focused on the CWL's national theme '*Ignite Your Passion*' and the significance of the word '*Passion*' which translates to '*endurance*' in Latin and '*agony*' in Greek. This talk provoked deep reflection on the impact of CWL's national theme in our day-to-day mission.

Following Jesus

Following Jesus religiously means going all the way to the cross. Along the way we meet disbelieving Pharisees and others who don't want to hear the truth.

It is possible to have an easy life as a Christian. We can successfully work hard at being so nice that we're liked by everyone all the time. We can avoid controversial issues. We can love others by only affirming them, never challenging them to new growth or a better understanding of healthy, holy living. We can go so far as to pray that God will lead the sinners we know to repentance, hoping that he'll do all the work. But none of this is true Christian living.

Scripture calls this type of Christian a "charlatan". It's a fake Christianity. It's certainly not a description of Jesus! Such people are deceived — they deceive themselves into thinking that they are okay simply because Jesus loves them and that he will take them to heaven when their time of being nice on earth is finished; for them, that's all that matters.

The problem with this is that it's very selfish. It shows a lack of concern for the condition of the souls of others. It's self-protective, guarding the comfort of an easy life, keeping it non-confrontational, avoiding persecution, sustaining the illusion that there is no real need to do otherwise — very likely at the cost of justice, love, and even the salvation of others.

If being Christian means being only nice, why do we need the Bible? St. Paul says, "All scripture is inspired by God for teaching, refutation and correction, and for training in righteousness." Oh-oh! It's not nice to refute lies and misconceptions. Nor is it easy to successfully give correction.

Sometimes, we are called to quietly smile and show love by our niceness; when we're with someone who is not ready to hear the truth, we can do more harm than good by forcing it upon them. At other times, we are called to show our love by speaking up about the truth, even if it stirs up trouble.

How do we know when to be quiet and when to speak up? Only by listening to the Holy Spirit and paying attention to the nudges and inspirations that come from the Lord.

What's the value of being a Christian if we don't care enough about others to tell them the difficult truths that will bring them closer to Christ? What's the value of following Christ if we don't stand up for the truth and go all the way to the cross with him for the sake of their eternal happiness?

Pope John III

July 17, 561- July13, 574

THE 61ST Pope

John III was the 61st Pope to hold the position. He served as pope for well over a decade. His papacy was marked by war and uncertainty. Many of the events during his leadership were out of his control, but Pope John III took action to protect the Church and the country.

Like many Popes of this era, not much is known about John III's early life. It's believed that he was born around the year 520 AD. He was born as Catelinus. From the little historical records available, it's been established that he was born in Rome to a relatively distinguished family.

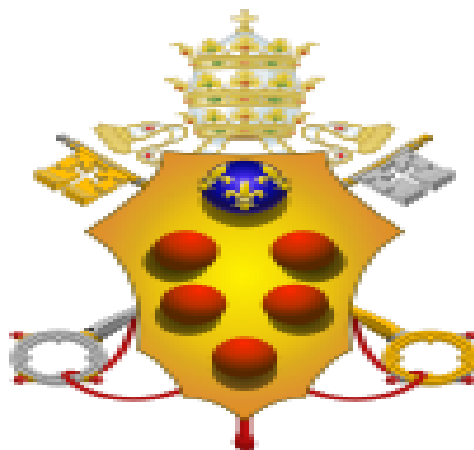
His father, Anastasius, was a high-ranking member of the Roman Senate. Thus, his family was quite influential in Rome.

Pope John III was officially elected and consecrated as Pope on July 17th, 561. There are several notable events that occurred during his papacy. The biggest is the invasion of Italy. The country was invaded by Lombards, which were Germanic people living North of Italy. Lombards reintroduced Arian belief to Italy, which was largely eradicated prior to the Pope's reign.

To avoid conflict, John III retreated to catacombs about two miles outside of the city. There, he hid from the public while still completing his duties as Pope. He remained in the catacombs until the death of Narses in 573. He returned to the Lateran Palace but dies about a year later, ending his papacy.

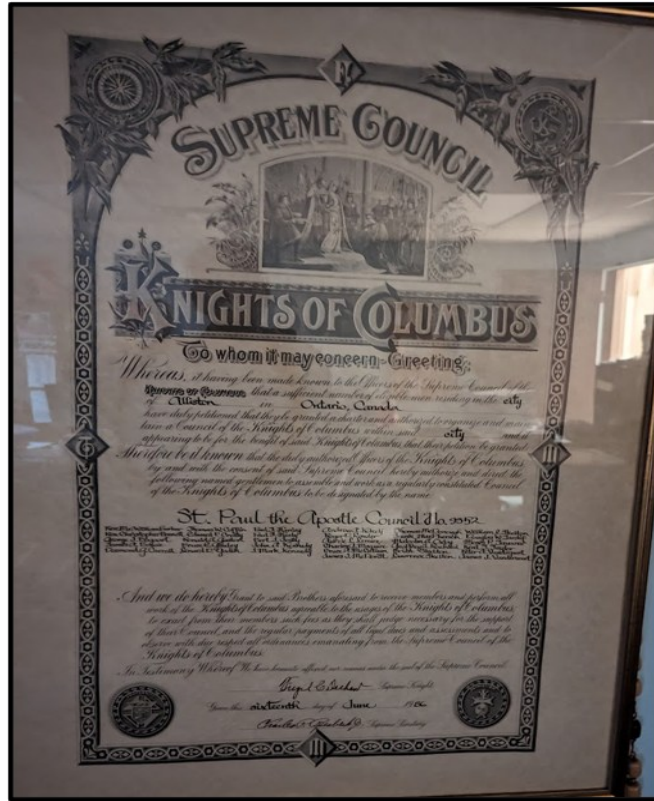
