

Brothers in Christ

This year marks the 758th celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi (Latin for "Body of Christ") – also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Since this is our parish feast day, which we'll celebrate next Sunday, it's helpful to know the history of this special day. The origin of Corpus Christi began with a Eucharistic miracle, which is a moment of divine intervention aimed at confirming the faith in the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. While there are many websites and resources documenting Eucharistic miracles throughout history, one of the best is the compilation by Blessed Carlos Acutis: miracolieucaristici.org. Here is the description of the event in 1263:

In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena [Italy] while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He... [was] a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal. The priest was immediately confused. At first, he attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope Urban IV resided. The Pope listened to the priest's account and absolved him. He then sent emissaries for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, he ordered the Bishop of the diocese to bring the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood to Orvieto. With archbishops, cardinals and other Church dig- nitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto. It is said that Pope Urban IV was prompted by this miracle to commission St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Proper for a Mass and an Office honoring the Holy Eucharist as the Body of Christ. One year after the miracle, in August instituted the feast of Corpus Christi.

This was when St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the hymn containing the verses of Tantum Ergo, which we still sing today during Eucharistic exposition! The papal bull, Transiturus, ordered Corpus Christi be celebrated annually on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday throughout the Latin Church. Why Thursday? Perhaps as a reminder that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper on the Thursday before His passion. In modern times, this feast is commonly transferred to the following Sunday to accommodate the faithful.

Mass was offered by the State Father Prior complete with a Fourth Degree Honour Guard. The evening highlite I would say was watching 7 Squires age out and become members of the Knights of Columbus(even if one of them did butt in front of me at Dinner).

Sunday was pretty quite with only the election of a new squire executive was held and discussion on the 2025 Joint Convention of the Ontario State Knights of Columbus and Ontario State Squires Circle in Ottawa. At this event Squires will be celebrating their 100th Anniversary of founding and the 125th Anniversary of Knights in Ontario.



Pope St. Celestine I

The 43rd Pope

Pope St. Celestine I is known for having been the first to deal with a new heresy, known to us as *Nestorianism*. Nestorius was the bishop of Constantinople when he began preaching the heretical idea that Christ was in fact two distinct persons, not a single person with both a divine and human nature. As icing on the cake, Nestorius also didn't like the descriptor *Theotokos, or "God-Bearer," that was often given to the Virgin Mary.*

Saying (probably), "How about you show Mom some respect," St. Cyril of Alexandria wrote to Celestine I, asking for his blessing to excommunicate Nestorius and condemn his teaching. Celestine gave Cyril the green light, which led to Nestorianism being condemned at the Council of Ephesus in 431.

In a sense, we can thank Celestine I for St. Patrick's Day. Just before his death, it was Celestine who commissioned Patrick, the great patron of Ireland, to begin evangelizing there – and in his last official act as pope.


